- NOTE:**
1. Employees or volunteers who operate a 15-passenger van while conducting activities for, or in behalf of the insured, must have a Commercial Driver's License (CDL), OR a Chauffeur's License, OR taken and passed a Defensive Driving Course.
  2. Drivers should be between the ages of 25 and 70.
  3. **ALL** employees and volunteers who drive their personal vehicles for insured activities must have minimum liability limits of \$100,000/\$300,000/\$100,000.
  4. Driver must have **NO** major moving violation and **NO MORE THAN ONE** minor moving violation for the prior three years. See below for list of violations.

MAJOR	MINOR
Driving while intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.	Any at-fault accidents
Failure to stop and report accident involvement.	Speed Equal to less than 10 mph over the limit.
Homicide/Assault while operating a vehicle.	Moving violation resulting in filing of evidence of Financial Responsibility.
Driver's license suspended, revoked, cancelled, or barred.	Altered license or unlawful use of license or permit.
Violation of Open Container Law.	Driving on the wrong side of the road or in the wrong direction.
Possession of alcohol or drugs.	Any passing violation.
Motor vehicle theft.	School bus or school zone.
Manslaughter or vehicular homicide.	Failures to yield at intersection, stop sign, or traffic device.
Carrying a concealed weapon.	Failure to yield to emergency vehicle.
Felony use of a motor vehicle.	
Careless/reckless driving.	
Drag racing or participating in speed contests.	
Speed in excess of 10 mph over the limit.
